Darla buys Governor's mansion

In \$50 million purchase, business tycoon says house needs 'fresh set of eyes'

South Carolina no longer has a governor's mansion.

In a surprising purchase, business tycoon Darla Moore bought the historic downtown mansion for \$50 million Thursday afternoon. The house marks her 68th property nationally and fifth inside the state.

"The house needs a fresh set of eyes," Moore said in a statement. "The current inhabitant didn't have the same vision for this house that I did. I believe in excellence in everything I do, and I wanted excellence for this house. I breed excellence, and those who do not breed excellence are the kind of people that I don't care to be around."

The house wasn't up for sale, as it was a state-owned historic property that laws said the state couldn't sell. But Moore found a little-known loophole in the law, convinced

the legislature to sell the house and flew in for the legal hearings in a three-hour period Thursday afternoon. She was back in her California mansion by 5 p.m.

It left current Gov. Nikki Haley scrambling to move her possessions out of the house. She will move into a one-bedroom apartment near Williams-Brice Stadium.

Haley didn't return calls for comment, but her spokesman said the move represented her continuing desire for smaller government.

"We didn't need this big house," the spokesman said in a statement. "When a state is trying to go back to the basic tenets of government, it surely doesn't need to fund a mansion. We thank Darla Moore for her continued service to this state."

The spokesman said Haley would likely appear in an upcoming edition of a TLC apartment remodeling show and would consider writing a how-to book on downsizing.

Moore said she doesn't plan to live in the house but will use it for an annual visit back to her home state. She will decorate the house

and build a \$10 million personal shrine to each business school student who graduates from the University of South Carolina. Her estimated wealth of \$685 trillion could run out within 126 years, according to current projections, but it's unlikely.

Moore might also teach an occasional seminar inside the house on how to perfect a beautiful Southern accent and look stunning. She might also teach others how to give billions away.

She will bar all media members from the house.

Sources near Moore say she may be purchasing other properties soon. During last week's visit to campus, she cast an adoring eye toward the Horseshoe. University leaders say they'd like to keep the historic Horseshoe but would sell if Moore wished to buy it.

"If Darla Moore wants the Horseshoe, who are we to say no?" said a well-dressed USC spokeswoman who refused to provide her name. "We believe in doing whatever Ms.

BURNING UP: Spicy chicken too hot to handle

Popular sandwich discontinued at Chick-fil-A

The spicy chicken sandwich has been discontinued at the Russell House Chick-fil-A after one student reported a burning sensation in her mouth Thursday night.

Paula Smith, a fourth-year public relations student, said she had never felt the burning sensation when eating regular Chick-fil-A sandwiches.

"It tasted like it was hot, but the sandwich was cold," Smith said. "I knew then there was only one explanation: I had been poisoned."

Thinking quickly, Smith immediately called an ambulance. USC EMT Cinna Attar arrived just in time to save her life.

"It was bad; she could have died," Attar said.

To rescue Smith, the EMTs had to postpone attending to another student with a spinal injury until Smith's condition was stable.

"The kid's a paraplegic now, but when it came to a choice between allowing someone to walk again and saving someone from a spicy chicken sandwich, I know we made the right decision," Attar said.

When Attar first arrived on the scene, he expected severe dehydration was to blame because Smith kept asking for water.

USC and Columbia Police and FBI agents are conducting a full-scale investigation of every Russell House eatery and Sodexo, the

company that provides food to the Grand Marketplace. Investigators believe that the toxin is not confined to the spicy chicken sandwiches.

"Students have reported similar burning sensations after eating certain products at Taco Bell, and substances similar to those in the spicy chicken sandwiches have been found in the hot sauces at Taco Bell and in the Grand Marketplace," said J. Edgar Hoover, the head of the FBI.

Hoover noted that packets of hot sauce were labeled mild, medium, hot and fire.

"It's different doses," Hoover said. "It's so easy, a terrorist could do it."

Investigators are considering shutting Taco Bell down as well. But the effort to contain the toxin may be too late. Later in the evening Thursday, Columbia Police got a frantic call from a waitress at the Wild Wings in the

USC yet again lowers standards for admission

USC lowered its acceptance criteria Thursday in response to criticism from state lawmakers for the decreasing percentage of in-state students the university admits.

Before, USC had automatically accepted every in-state student with at least a 1000 SAT score and a 3.0 GPA. Now, the university is accepting every in-state student who can complete a connect-the-dots puzzle and think of three words that rhyme with "cat."

"It's a really tough word to rhyme," said Eddy Ott, a senior linguistics professor at USC. "Bat, sat, hat ... See, I'm all out."

Ott then tried to complete the university's connect-the-dots entrance examination. After two hours of intense concentration, he threw his robin's egg blue crayon against the wall in frustration and began sobbing.

"I'm stupid and fat," Ott cried. "Hey, fat — that's another one!"

The lowered standards are expected to attract a caliber of student never before seen at the university. More than 90 percent of incoming freshmen are will be public relations students, and all will join Greek Life.

The move has necessitated an overhaul in curriculum. Within the English department, courses on William Faulkner and William Shakespeare have been replaced by ones on Stephanie Meyer and Dr. Seuss.

"This is the USC I remember," said South Carolina Speaker of the House Bobby Harrell, an alumnus who had previously criticized the university for its academic selectivity. "Edward Cullen is so gorgeous!"

State Treasurer Curtis Loftis, despite being on Team Jacob, agreed.

"One fish, two fish, red fish, blue fish," Loftis said. "Black fish, blue fish, old fish, new fish!"

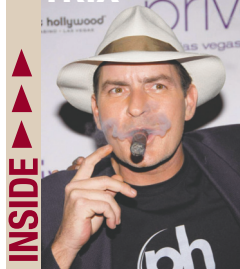

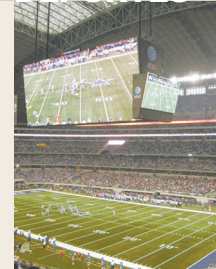

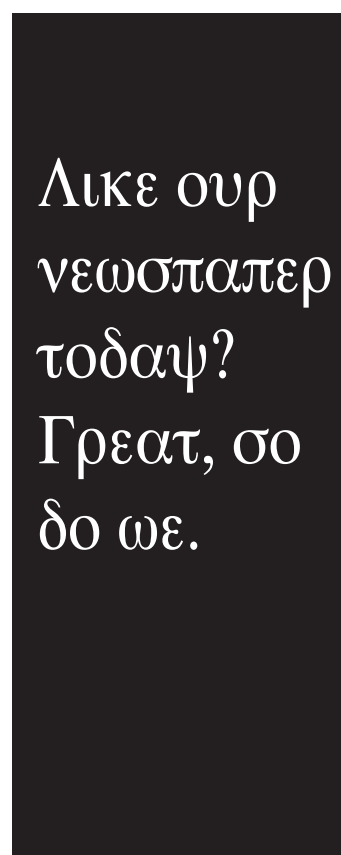

Gambrell floors mopped, students notified via text

Carolina Alert does its job, informs USC of hazard

Carolina Alert worked. Students received text messages, emails and saw notifications on VIP Thursday that the floors of Gambrell Hall were mopped using a new Scrubbing Bubbles formula that created a slippery and wet area that was hazardous to students.

The message read: "Gamby floors soaked. Do not take stairs or elevators. Avoid at all costs."

The mopped floors extended across the main lobby of Gambrell preventing students who had been in class during the mopping from leaving the building.

"I had to sit in my history classroom for about three hours waiting on the floors to dry," said Collins Soup, a second-year international studies student.

While the text messages and online notifications helped students, most people felt the

new ALERT FM radio signal text messages were the most efficient way of letting people know.

"I was walking out of my dorm, and the box beeped loudly and the light flashed," first-year biology student Shannon Greely said. "Thank goodness I saw that box because I never would have checked my cell phone or Facebook before my class at Gambrell."

Greely decided not to go to class in order to avoid the water situation and went to the Horseshoe and played in rain puddles instead.

USC's emergency management team felt it was necessary that the entire university needed to be aware of the dangerous situation.

"We were incredibly proud that our system was so efficient and notified students promptly so they could respond however they saw fit," a Carolina Alert spokesperson said.

The system did work but only for those who received the messages.

"My cell phone battery had died, I forgot my password to my Twitter, I can't ever remember how to spell VIP and I haven't even seen those radio ALERT FML thingies," said Lauria Gold, fourth-year civil engineering student.

As a result of not receiving the Carolina Alert messages she walked straight through the lobby of Gambrell and almost fell.

"It was like I stumbled over a brick on the Horseshoe," Gold said. "It was so traumatizing."

Gold said she's never wearing 5-inch heels to class again and that she would have liked better notification of the wet floors.

"I just wish they could have used that thing they test every Friday, where Cocky cock-a-doodle-does, to announce across campus that the floors were wet," Gold said. "I mean, it's, like, clearly a safety issue."

The CarolinaCard has officially been taken off campus and is set to launch today. The student debit card can now be used for all Gamecock shopping expenditures.

Local businesses such as Cool Beans, Yoghut and Natural Vibrations are all welcoming the extra business the CarolinaCard option will bring.

Students can also use their Carolina Cash to buy drinks at Five Points bars including Bey's, Grandma's, Sharky's and Pour House. "Thirsty Thursdays will never be the same," said Edwin Quest, a fifth-year sports management student. "I don't have to use my own money to buy girls drinks anymore. I can just spend the money my parents put on my CarolinaCard for the textbooks I never bought at the beginning of the year."

Rock slide at Strom Fitness and Wellness Center

Students flee as wall comes tumbling down

Strom Thurmond Wellness and Fitness Center is on the rocks after a devastating rock slide occurred at the climbing wall Thursday night, injuring dozens in its fall and ruining over \$1 million in fitness equipment.

According to witnesses, the slide happened around 6:30 p.m. — widely regarded as prime climbing time in the world of rocks — and was completely spontaneous.

"Dude ... dude," said avid climber and third-year physical education student Dave Biener. "I felt like I was James Franco in '127 Hours' — minus chopping my arm off."

Several students who were working out at the time of the event noticed and proceeded to run for their lives.

"I'm so glad I work out 24/7, so I was totally trained to run the hell out of there. I saw the rocks just fall. I think I'll stick with weights for now on," second-year environmental studies student Chad Brochill said.

Unfortunately, Brochill may not be able to "stick with weights" for much

longer. The event has led to a further investigation by campus officials on the safety on the Strom's fitness equipment, and they are now proposing a total recall of all treadmills, ellipticals and rowing machines. Students can anticipate a complete shutdown of the popular gym in the coming weeks, according to officials.

"We can't take this chance again. A landslide won't bring us down," Strom Thurmond spokesman Trad Mill said.

The decision will be made before the semester is finished, so those working to pursue a summer beach body can basically forget it.

"If the Strom closes

down, my dad will be making a call. I may be able to lose the weight later, but the pictures from my friends' cruise to Rio will last forever," first-year exercise science student Priscilla McTiff said.

No fatalities were reported from the rock wall, but everyone was told to "take a chill pill" by Outdoor Recreation employees.

We're talking about a \$5 million fountain in front of Thomas Cooper Library.

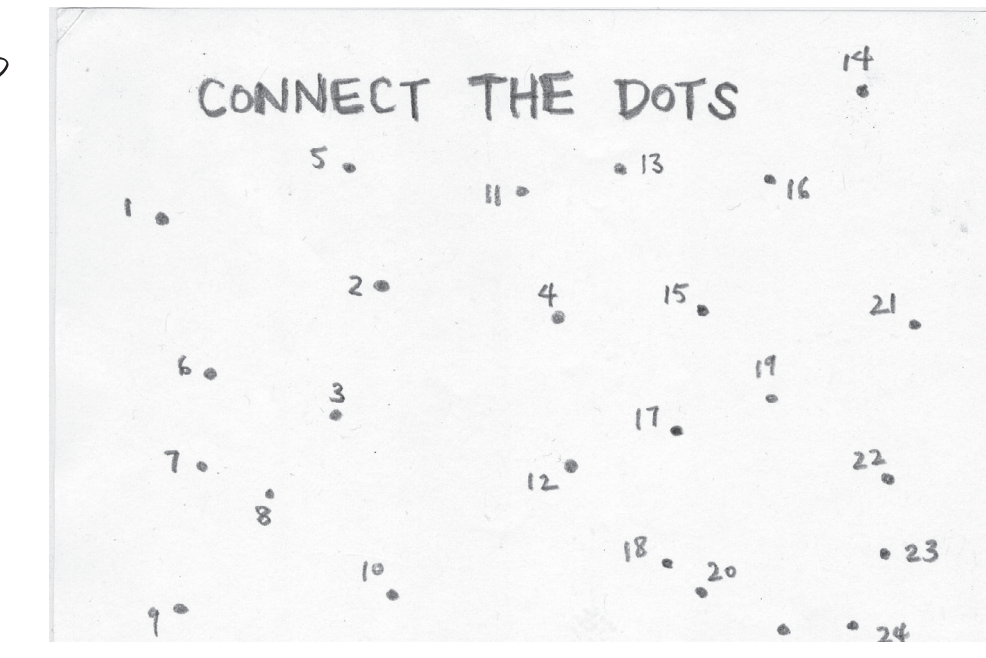

Message boarders win

Hyman approves new video board, helmets

As a sign of good will to the legion of Gamecock fans who frequent Internet message boards, USC Athletics Director Eric Hyman announced Thursday he will address long-held concerns expressed on the forums.

"We feel the Carolina fans are the best in America," said Hyman in a release. "Accordingly, we want to take to heart some of the finest suggestions from the most active and forward-thinking minds that make up the Gamecock Nation."

The largest step the athletic department is undertaking is the new installation of a video board inside Williams-Brice Stadium. The new screen will be 10 times the size of the current and much-maligned screen and resemble the video board at Cowboys Stadium in Arlington, Texas.

"We've made tremendous steps toward competing for the SEC and national championships in terms of recruiting, facilities and coaching, but I think we all know what's holding us

back is the video board," said third-year sociology student Bob Roberts, who uses the online forum handle "LordoftheSpur37."

He added, "Now that we can efficiently watch the game on a big television instead of actually paying attention to what is happening on the field, I think the fan experience will be that much better."

USC will also unveil new uniforms this coming season. The jerseys and pants will undergo mostly minor cosmetic tweaks, with the most drastic change being an all-garnet helmet with a white fighting Gamecock logo.

"I really can't give you a good reason as to why so many of us fans have been so adamant about garnet helmets," fourth-year English student Katie Kapowski, also known as "LadyBillyBrice," said. "But we just want them. I mean, white is kind of boring. Besides, if you don't want garnet helmets, you're just a Tater."

Hyman also announced plans to

erase any mention of former coach Brad Scott from the school record books, as well as establish a toll-free hotline USC fans can utilize to have any pressing questions they have about Gamecock athletics answered in a friendly and timely manner.

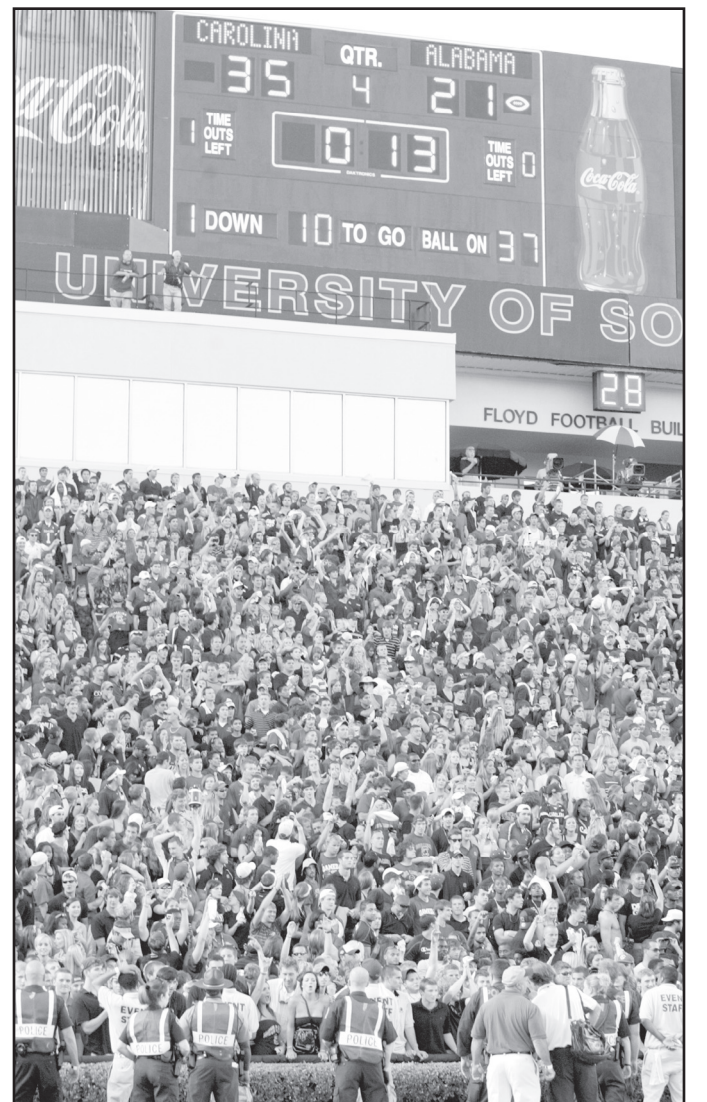
"The same questions keep coming up again and again," athletic department secretary Jane Doe said. "Every day, someone calls and asks what channel a game is on, when the Spring Game is, is so-and-so still on the team, etc. Now, we have a function to meet those queries in a more efficient manner."

Two demands most message board frequenters have Hyman does not plan on accommodating. Hyman said he will not ban The State newspaper from covering the team. Also, he said cries to return men's basketball games from the state-of-the-art Colonial Life Arena to the much smaller Carolina Coliseum will not be heard. Fans have complained the new building is too sterile and large to fit USC's usually small crowds, but Hyman said there are no plans to change venues.

Dodgeball to be SEC sport

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (AP) — In a historic move, the Southeastern Conference announced Thursday it will sanction dodgeball as a fall sport starting in 2013.

"Dodgeball has grown from a figment of playgrounds across the nation to a highly competitive and exciting sport," commissioner Ike Blive said. "We are ecstatic to have it join the SEC family."

Eleven of the league's 12 members, including USC, will adopt the sport. Vanderbilt will not sanction dodgeball, announcing in a release that it "actually takes scholastic athletics seriously, unlike the rest of the league."

USC Athletics Director Eric Hyman said the school would begin a formal coaching search for someone to head Carolina's new program in the coming weeks.

The Gamecock dodgeball team, which will be co-ed along with the rest of the SEC, is expected to play home matches in the Volleyball Competition Facility. The inaugural SEC Dodgeball Tournament of Champions will be held Dec. 15 to 17, 2013 in Atlanta.

Fan aptitude test for student tickets

Controversial new measure added to TicketReturn process

The South Carolina student section was voted the fifth-best in the nation by ESPN last year.

This coming season, it will have an opportunity to prove it is just that.

Due to new student ticketing regulations established by Student Government Thursday, all students will have to pass a Gamecock football aptitude test in order to be eligible for entry into the ticketing lottery.

"Aside from a dance-off, I think this is the best plan we could've come up with," said SG President Joe Wright. "This will ensure students who truly care about the team will be able to attend games."

The test will consist of 10 multiple-choice questions each week. The questions will vary week to week; some will be about the current team while other will deal with the history of Gamecock football. Students have three

chances to get a perfect score and advance their names into the lottery, which will operate as it has in the past.

Many students said they were in favor of the measure.

"This is an awesome thing," first-year biology student Jake Taylor said. "Now I don't have to worry about a bunch of idiots who know nothing about football keeping me out on game day."

Others expressed disappointment.

"This is crazy, y'all," second-year public relations student Missy Graham said. "I go out and buy seven different black dresses, and now you tell me I've got to pass a dumb test each week to be able to sneak my flask into that concrete atrocity?"

Wright said the measure will not be reconsidered but will be reevaluated at the end of the season. USC's first home game of the 2011 season is on Sept. 17 against Navy.
