K. L. GOODWIN: Lecturer in English Literature at the University of Queensland, Australia; at present on leave, engaged in research on William Morris at Balliol College, Oxford; educated at the University of Sydney. His book, The Influence of Ezra Pound, which touches on William Soutar and Hugh MacDiarmid, is to appear from Oxford University Press, London.

Donald MACDONALD: Born in Scotland; educated in Scotland, Union of South Africa, and United States; Ph.D. from Northwestern University (dissertation: "Verse Satire and Humor in Middle Scots"). Presently Assistant Professor at Wayne State University.
