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Friendship album, 1820s–1880s, probably compiled by the family of the Reverend Dr. Alexander Marshall (d. 1876), rector of St. David's Church, Cheraw (1829–1841), and St. John's Chapel, Charleston (1841–1876), contains handwritten poetry, clippings, and photographs of St. John's, and most notably two watercolor views of St. David's painted in 1839 by Irish-born miniaturist Alfred S. Waugh (ca. 1810–1856). The watercolors offer two different views of the church, "Morning," showing the north side and front of the church with a couple standing in the foreground and a man in the background climbing the front steps, and "Evening," showing the south side and back of the church with a funeral procession from the church to the cemetery. Several examples of Waugh's portraiture survive, including an example at the Metropolitan Museum of Art, but these signed and dated views of St. David's are his only known landscapes. **Acquired for the Library by the University South Caroliniana Society.**
