HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH 41 MILLION NATIVE SPANISH SPEAKERS IN THE UNITED STATES

"Pioneers of Change: Shaping the Future Together" is this year's Hispanic Heritage Month theme. Vista Higher Learning, who invited El Centro back in April to present strategies on advocacy and multilingualism to a national audience, highlights the following about this year's theme: "With more than 41 million native Spanish speakers in the country, Spanish is not only a means of communication, but also a manifestation of culture, history, and resilience. In a context where the pioneers of change are shaping the future, preserving and promoting the language becomes crucial to keeping cultural roots alive, while also driving innovation and inclusion...language emerges as a key tool for bringing communities together and acts as a catalyst for change. 


Welcome to USC Upstate NEW DIRECTOR


