### Henry Radcliffe Murphy

Henry Radcliffe Murphy, a student at the University of South Carolina Law School, was born July 19, 1927 and died in Charleston July 16, 1950. Though his life was short his accomplishments were many and outstanding.

In 1944, upon reaching the age of seventeen years, he volunteered to serve his Country in the United States Marine Corps. This he did with distinction until he was discharged in 1946.

In 1949 he was graduated from the College of Charleston with a degree of Bachelor of Science. While there he enjoyed the affection and respect of the students and faculty because of his inherent brilliance and good natured manner. Upon graduating he was commissioned a Second Lieutenant in the United States Army and served in the parachute troops.

He entered the Law School February 2, 1950 where he immediately impressed, most favorably, all with whom he came in contact. He was known as an independent thinker, entertaining thoughts of great significance. High principles and personal integrity were the theme of his character. In friendship, he was loyal and sincere. A tribute to his legal ability and scholarly attainments is the fact that he stood first in his class. It is with a feeling of great loss that we mourn the passing of our friend and fellow student.
