The earlier you submit your requests to us, the easier it will be to work out appropriate scheduling.

Marketing Libraries:

Dynamic Roles in a Global Society

At the January 18th Planning Session, we announced the theme for this year's conference: "Marketing Libraries - Dynamic Roles in a Global Society." As we all know, libraries and the services they provide have changed dramatically in the last ten years. As we move closer to the twenty-first century, change will continue at an even faster pace. We, as any business, must strive to stay one jump ahead of our changing image, and market our libraries to their fullest potential.

Norman Belk has also joined our committee, and will share his recent experiences as the Local Arrangements Chairman of the 1991 Conference.

1992 marks the 20th anniversary of the Library School at the University of South Carolina. The December, 1991, issue of *American Libraries* reported that enrollment at USC's library school has tripled in ten years. Dean Roper and Pat Feehan have activities planned throughout the year to celebrate the achievement of their 20th anniversary, and they have accepted our invitation to participate in SCLA 1992.

The SCLA Planning Committee at our January 18th meeting distributed a survey of topics for possible convention programs, and asked those present to rate these on a scale of 1 to 5 (1 being the highest interest and 5 being of no interest). For your information we are listing the results of that survey including write-in topics which were given in the "other suggestions" category.

Memberships have typically accounted for 35% of the annual SCLA budget. We appreciate your support, and encourage you to get a friend to support SCLA through a new membership. The stronger our state organization becomes financially, the more effective we can be in enhancing services to our membership.

We hope to see all of you at the Sheraton-Columbia in October.



The celebration honors Augusta Baker and recognizes her distinguished career as a librarian, storyteller, teacher, and author. She is currently Storyteller-in-Residence at the University of South Carolina's College of Library and Information Science.

John Bierhorst, named the August Baker Lecturer, is an editor and translator of American Indian Literature. He serves as a consulting editor for the Center of Inter-American Relations and a reviewer for the National Endowment for the Humanities.

The Colloquium speaker will be Anne Pellowski, founder and former Director of the Information Center on Children's Cultures of the U.S. Committee for UNICEF. She was formerly a children's librarian and storytelling specialist at the New York Public Library. Pellowski has told and collected stories throughout the world and is the author of a number of books for children and adults.





Outstanding Librarian Award

Purpose

To recognize and honor a librarian who has initiated or developed an imaginative or creative program, service, or work of enduring value, including significant professional writings, for the effective use of or increased interest in libraries or a particular library.

Criteria

1. The recipient must be in active service and a member of the South Carolina Library Association.
2. The award will recognize contributions made within five years preceding January 1 of the award year.

3. The award will be given to a person who has served in any type of library--academic, public, school, or special.
4. Nominations must be made in writing to the Chairman of the Awards Committee. (Nomination forms can be obtained from the SCLA Executive Secretary, as indicated above).
5. The deadline for nominations is May 31, 1992.
6. The award will be presented at a general session of the annual conference, as specified by the Executive Board and the Awards Committee.

Friend Of Libraries Award

Purpose

To recognize a person's or organization's outstanding service to a library or libraries. This service should have furthered the expansion of library service in the state.

Criteria

1. The award may be given to a person or an organization having been a "friend" to any type of library--academic, public, school, or special.
2. The service to a library on which the award is

based must have occurred within the past five years preceding January 1 of the award year.

3. The contribution made by the person or the organization may include, but not be limited to, financial benevolence.
4. Nominations must be made in writing to the Chairman of the Awards Committee.
5. The deadline for the nominations is May 31, 1992.
6. The award will be presented at a general session of the annual conference, as specified by the Executive Board and the Awards Committee.
