# TO THIS ISSUE

L. L. LEE: Assistant Professor at Western Washington State College. Has published articles in *The Western Humanities Review, Studies in Short Fiction, College English,* and has had an article accepted by *Wisconsin Studies in Contemporary Literature*. He has also published translations and poetry in *Poetry* and the *New Mexico Quarterly*.

COLEMAN O. PARSONS: B.A., Columbia University; Ph.D., Yale University. Professor of English at The City College and Graduate Professor of English and Comparative Literature at Hunter College, where he teaches a doctoral seminar in Scottish literature. Author of Witcheraft and Demonology in Scott's Fiction (Edinburgh, 1964) and of articles in The Virginia Quarterly Review, Antioch Review, South Atlantic Quarterly, American Literature, Modern Language Review, Review of English Studies, and other journals.

A.G.D. WILES: Having taken his doctorate at Princeton in the English Renaissance, he was for twenty-four years (from 1936 to 1960) head of the Department of English at The Citadel. In 1960 he became President of Newberry College. He has published in learned journals and is co-author of English for the Armed Forces: A Handbook of Reading, Writing, and Speaking (New York, 1943), used widely in the Army Student Training Program in the colleges during World War II.
