CONTRIBUTORS TO THIS ISSUE

James ANDERSON: Is a Scottish schoolmaster in Edinburgh. He was awarded the Ph.D. at Edinburgh University in 1965 with a thesis "Sir Walter Scott and History," which gained him the Hume Brown Senior Prize in Scottish History. During the academic year 1965-1966 he held a Carnegie Fellowship for study of the Scottish historians after Scott.

Louis B. HALL: Associate Professor of English, University of Colorado. Author of the only modern English translation of Boccaccio's *De casibus virorum illustrium*, *The Fates of Illustrious Men* and of various articles on the influence of the *Aeneid* on Medieval narration and on the importance of Gavin Douglas' translation in the Renaissance. Hopkins Fellow at the Bodleian Library, Oxford, 1959-1960.

T. K. MEIER: Holds degrees from the University of Texas, Columbia, and Harvard. Has previously published in Seventeenth Century literature, and has formerly taught with the University of Virginia and the College of William and Mary.

Walter SCHEPS: Took his B.A. at the City College of New York and his Ph.D. at the University of Oregon. Is at present Assistant Professor of English at Case Western Reserve University. Has published an essay on Chaucer and is currently doing research on Blind Harry's *Wallace* and literature of Scotland in the Fourteenth and Fifteenth Centuries.
