CONTRIBUTORS TO THIS ISSUE

Thomas CRAWFORD: Of the English Dept., Aberdeen University. Author of *Burns: A Study of the Poems and Songs* (1960) and *Scott* (1965—Writers and Critics series).

John J. DUNN: A.B., Harvard; Ph.D., Duke; at present Assistant Professor at St. John's University, N. Y. Edited the Augustan Reprint Society edition of Macpherson's *Fragments of Ancient Poetry*. Completing a supplement to Black's bibliography of Ossian.

Robert H. MacDONALD: English Department, Carleton University, Ottawa. Author of a forthcoming book, *The Library of Drummond of Hawthornden*, to be published by the Edinburgh University Press.

William MONTGOMERIE: Of Dundee. Author of several volumes of poetry. Continues his bibliography which was originally submitted to Edinburgh University for the Ph.D.

Peter F. MORGAN: Associate Professor, University of Toronto. A previous contributor to SSL. Is studying the creative and critical contributions of the leading periodicals during the first part of the nineteenth century.

Ian Crichton SMITH: A poet in both the Gaelic and Doric tradition. This is the first of a series of his essays on Scottish literature which will be published in SSL.

James L. SMITH: Educated at St. Edmund Hall, Oxford, as an open scholar—B.A.; M.Litt. Henry Fellow at Yale University, 1962; presently Lecturer at Southampton University. Has edited McGonagall's *Last Poetic Gems* (1968) as well as a selection, *The Great McGonagall* (1968), and is writing a life of the poet. Has also published on Kyd's *Spanish Tragedy* and Marlowe's *Jew of Malta*.

Robert D. THORNTON: Chairman of the Division of Literature and Philosophy, State University College, New Paltz, N. Y. Author of *James Currie: The En'ire Stranger & Robert Burns* (1963); editor of *The Tuneful Flame: Songs of Robert Burns as he Sang Them* (1957); and author of numerous articles on Burns and eighteenth-century Scotland.

Terence TOBIN: Assistant Professor of English at Purdue. At present writing a history of the theater in Scotland from the beginnings to 1800.

G. A. M. WOOD: Has taught at Yale University and the University of California, Santa Barbara; now with the University of Stirling. Is collecting Walter Scott letters which were not published in the edition prepared by Grierson.
