#### FOREWORD

Herein presented are articles completing the eighth Annual Survey of South Carolina Law, covering the period from April 1, 1960 through March 31, 1961. The length of this eighth Survey has necessitated its publication in two installments, the first of which appeared in the Fall, 1961 issue of the Quarterly, Vol. 14, No. 1. All published decisions of the South Carolina Supreme Court during the indicated period are included, as well as cases involving South Carolina law decided by the Fourth Circuit Court of Appeals and the United States Supreme Court.
