REPORT: Committee on Admissions

The Committee on Admissions has two items:

1) Admissions requirements for the Program for Accelerated College Education (PACE) Program, in which high school students take USC courses in their high schools.

To be added to the admissions section of the Undergraduate Bulletin, page 15, between the *Concurrent* and *Auditor* sections:

PACE. The Program for Accelerated College Education is made available to South Carolina high school students through a cooperative effort of participating, USC academic departments, the Office of Distance Education and Instructional Support and the State Department of Education. High-school juniors and seniors have the opportunity to earn three semester hours of college credit for the successful completion of each course. To be eligible to enroll in a PACE course a student must have a minimum, cumulative high school grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale, or have a Scholastic Assessment Test total score of 1100 or higher (ACT composite score of 24 or higher). If SAT or ACT scores are not available, a student may be admitted with a PSAT score of 110 or higher.

2) College of Science and Mathematics: Delete the Bachelor of Science in Medical Technology program and include it as an option under the B.S.I.S. degree. Change the admission requirements to 100 credit hours of undergraduate work with a minimum GPA of 2.75.
