

REPORT OF
ADMISSIONS COMMITTEE

On May 8, 1985, the University Faculty Admissions Committee passed a resolution to change effective Fall, 1986 to an early selective admission policy, to wit: "Applicants who predict a 3.0 gpr or higher will be accepted on or following December 1. On March 1, the predicted grade point average will be determined to create a freshman class of 2,500 students excluding provisional year students."

The Admissions Committee recommends this change in admission requirements for the provisional year for Fall, 1986:

Current Wording

Enrollment will be limited to 250 students. Students offered admission to this program will be drawn from freshman applicants whose predicted grade point average as determined by the U.S.C. admissions formula is at least 1.75 but less than 2.0.

Proposed Wording

Enrollment will be limited to 250 students. Students offered admission to this program will be drawn from freshman applicants whose predicted grade point average as determined by the U.S.C. admissions formula falls within .25 below the predicted grade point average ~~for~~ admission to a baccalaureate program.
