

ANNUAL REPORT 1982-83

Faculty Advisory Committee

The Faculty Advisory Committee met regularly after each meeting of the Faculty Senate and on other occasions by special call.

Major items of business included:

1. Advice to the Senate on the desirability of adopting a new student discipline system as proposed by the Faculty Student Affairs Committee. (See FS 12/1/82)
2. Report, after consultation with the Chairman and the Provost, interpreting University Academic Regulations regarding suspended students and summer school. (FS 3/2/83)
3. A report to the Faculty Senate on April 6, 1983, pursuant to a directive by the Senate on February 2, 1983, "to evaluate the process used in eliminating the undergraduate program in the College of Education."
4. In further response to Item 3, the committee considered possible revisions in the Faculty Manual. No changes were proposed.
5. Consideration of a draft amendment of the University Patent and Copyright Policy, which was later passed by the Faculty Senate and then referred to the committee for further action preparatory to revision of the Faculty Manual. (FS 5/4/83)
6. Report to the Faculty Senate on the idea of the "Summer Sabbatical" which the committee found inappropriate for inclusion in the Faculty Manual, though possibly attractive and administratively feasible in certain cases. (FS 3/2/83, 5/4/83)
7. Consideration of the reported misuse of the Educational Psychology 399 course designation and related matters.
8. Consideration, pursuant to referral by the Chairman of the Senate of questions raised in the Senate on May 4, 1983, regarding Tenure Regulations and Academic Grievance Procedures. (Report in progress)
9. Participating in preparing a slate of nominees for the University Tenure and Promotion Committee (in conjunction with the Welfare Committee and outgoing members of the Tenure & Promotion Committee).
10. Participation by the Chairman, ex officio, on the Senate Steering Committee and the Faculty-Board of Trustees Liaison Committee (Board of Trustees Academic Affairs Committee.)
