Description:

Logic, number theory, sequences, series, recursion, mathematical induction, set theory, enumeration, functions, relations, graphs and trees. Connections to computers and to programming are emphasized when possible.

Justification:

Student performance has indicated that that current prerequisites for MATH 174 are set too low to ensure student success. At the request of the degree programs populating this course, we propose raising the prerequisites to the level of precalculus or higher.

Description:

Continuation of PHYS 541. Study of topics from Advanced Optics, Astronomy, Biophysics, Digital Electronics, Nuclear/Particle Physics, or Solid State Physics, plus conduction of a physics experiment, including a written paper and an oral presentation.

Justification:

1. The Physics Department is revamping its undergraduate advanced laboratory curriculum to emphasize hands-on laboratory work. PHYS542 is part of that project, along with PHYS310 and PHYS541, and the concomitant deletion of PHYS308 and PHYS309. Currently, the laboratory portion of the general physics major consists of only 5 out of 42 credit hours. Thus, less than 1/7th of the coursework is hands-on experimental work. One third of that is at the 200-level. The new set of courses will increase the experimental component to at least 8 hours, and up to 11, depending on a student's choices. This will enhance our students' competitiveness for graduate

school or positions in industry, and will allow them develop an appreciation of issues unique to experimentation.

In PHYS 542 students will perform the experiment they designed in PHYS 541. This will include a write-up of a scientific paper and an oral presentation. Students will also study in-depth two topics from advanced experimental physics.

This change is necessary as the required credit hours for the degree have been reduced from 124 hours to 120 hours. With the reduction, only a minimum of 2 hours of electives is needed.</p>
