Experimental Courses - *Approved*

PHIL 319X KNOWLEDGE AND REALITY. (3) Examination of sceptical attacks, critical defenses, and philosophical theories of what we know and what is to be taken as ultimate reality.

PHIL 527X VIRTUES, ACTS AND CONSEQUENCES. (3) (Prereq: PHIL 211 or consent of instructor) This course addresses recent contributions to three central strands of ethical theory: virtue theory, deontology and utilitarianism. At least two of these three theories will be addressed in any given semester. The course examines both historical roots and recent developments.

PHIL 535X ECOFEMINISM. (3) (Prereq: 3 hours in philosophy beyond the 100 level or consent of instructor) An exploration of the connections between oppression of women and oppression of nature.

Maymester Course - *Approved*

PHIL 334M OPEN TO THE PUBLIC: EXPLORATIONS IN PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SPACE. (3) An investigation of the 'public sphere', its historical significance and recent transformation. Philosophical questioning is combined with on-site explorations.
