Experimental Courses - Approved

- PHIL 319X KNOWLEDGE AND REALITY. (3) Examination of sceptical attacks, critical defenses, and philosophical theories of what we know and what is to be taken as ultimate reality.
- PHIL 527X VIRTUES, ACTS AND CONSEQUENCES. (3) (Prereq: PHIL 211 or consent of instructor) This course addresses recent contributions to three central strands of ethical theory: virtue theory, deontology and utilitarianism. At least two of these three theories will be addressed in any given semester. The course examines both historical roots and recent developments.
- PHIL 535X ECOFEMINISM. (3) (Prereq: 3 hours in philosophy beyond the 100 level or consent of instructor) An exploration of the connections between oppression of women and oppression of nature.

Maymester Course - Approved

PHIL 334M OPEN TO THE PUBLIC: EXPLORATIONS IN PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SPACE. (3) An investigation of the 'public sphere', its historical significance and recent transformation. Philosophical questioning is combined with on-site explorations.
