


ANNUAL REPORT, BOOKSTORE COMMITTEE

The Bookstore Committee met twice during the academic year 1984-85. In the first meeting on October 16, it was decided: (1) to represent the faculty with respect to student complaints about selling back textbooks to the bookstore, and (2) to poll the faculty for suggestions about the bookstore. A request for suggestions was placed in the Update of November 2 and Mr. William Rorie of the University Bookstore was invited to attend the next meeting.

In the next meeting of November 20, it was decided not to discuss further the student complaints about the resale of textbooks, because, in spite of the offer of the committee to mediate the conflict, the Academics Committee of Student Government had already aired its complaints in a general letter to the faculty and in a news article in the Gamecock. The small number of complaints from the faculty poll were then discussed with Mr. Rorie. These complaints concerned the deadline for submitting book orders, the notification of when books are out of print, and the time in the semester when textbooks are removed from the store.
