REPORT OF THE SCHOLASTIC STANDARDS AND PETITIONS COMMITTEE

The Committee has one item to report to the Senate.

I. College of Pharmacy - Catalogue Change

Add the following statement as a paragraph to page 181U of the Undergraduate Bulletin between the headings CLASS AND LABORATORY ATTENDANCE and CURRICULA: (See attached)

Clerkship sites may require special immunization for students to be on rotations at the site. Students may be required to obtain the required immunizations at their own expense prior to their clinical rotation.

Any student will be placed on probation who (1) achieves an average below 2.0 in any semester, or (2) incurs two deficiencies (grades below C) in any one semester. Probation will be removed if the student makes a GPA of 2.0 with not more than one grade lower than C in courses pursued during the next regular session enrollment. No student who fails to meet conditions of probation will be promoted to the next year.

Students on probation will not be permitted to seek or hold offices in any student organization nor to represent the College of Pharmacy in any capacity, nor should they undertake any outside work.

Dismissal. The College of Pharmacy adheres to the dismissal policy of the University of South Carolina with the exception noted above in the promotion requirements. A student who has been suspended or has been withdrawn from the College of Pharmacy and subsequently readmitted will be subject to the current curriculum and regulations on promotion, probation, and dismissal.

Class and Laboratory Attendance

Students enrolled in the College of Pharmacy are expected to attend all classes, recitations, clerkships, externships, and laboratories and University attendance requirements must be fulfilled. A student must attend 90 percent of lectures and 100 percent of the laboratories in each pharmacy course. Laboratory, recitation, clerkships, externships, and examination makeups will be permitted only in the case of excused absences.

Curricula

Curriculum for the Pharm. D. Degree

Course requirements for the Pharm. D. are outlined below.

Twenty-one or 22 hours in the pre-pharmacy program are designated for elective study which must be in the humanities or social sciences except as noted below. Three hours must be in history and three hours must be in the fine arts. BIOL 101, 102, MATH 142, CHEM 321, 321L, 541, 541L, 542, 542L, and CSCI 101 may be selected as electives in the College of Science and Mathematics.

Professional electives in the first, second, and third professional years must be taken from courses offered by the College of Pharmacy. Electives in the fourth professional year may be taken from courses offered by any college in the University; however, courses within a specific discipline must be numbered above any required courses in the pre-pharmacy program. DPHR 655 is not considered a professional elective. Exceptions to this requirement must be approved by the Admissions, Scholastic Standings and Petitions Committee of the College.
