RELG 105 RELIGION IN AMERICA. (3) Communities, persons, themes and events which have helped to shape the religious climate in America; with emphasis on Christian communities.

RELG 342 THE AFRICAN-AMERICAN RELIGIOUS EXPERIENCE. (3) Introduction to the study of the religious traditions of African-Americans; special emphasis on the socio-political contexts in which these religious traditions have developed.
