The Faculty Senate approved the following catalogue changes as amended:

1. Repetition of course work (University Catalogue, p. 14)

From: A student may repeat a course he has passed in order to raise his grade only in the event that the college in which he is seeking a degree requires a higher grade in the course. A student who repeats a course will have both course registrations entered on his permanent academic record and computed with his grade point ratio.

To: When a course is repeated, both grades will be entered on the student's permanent academic record and included in the grade point ratio, but he will receive course credit toward graduation only once, unless otherwise stipulated in the course description.

2. Minimum course work at the University (Catalogue, p. 18)

From: A student planning to pursue work at other institutions or through correspondence or off-campus extension classes must complete this work before attaining senior classification (90 semester hours) since the last 30 credits (representing the senior year's work) must be earned in residence at the University.

To: A student planning to pursue work at other institutions or through correspondence or off-campus extension classes must complete this work before attaining senior classification (90 semester hours). The last 30 credits (representing the senior year's work) must be earned in residence at the University and at least twelve hours of the student's major courses must be earned at the University. Some programs impose larger student residence and/or major requirements.

3. and (Catalogue, p. 21)

From: The senior year of work (30 semester hours) must be completed in residence at the University.

To: The senior year of work (30 semester hours) must be completed in residence at the University, and at least twelve hours of the student's major courses must be taken at the University. Some programs impose larger student residence and/or major requirements.
