The following revision in standards for the Bachelor of Music Program is presented for information, and

This change will be included in the Fall 1991 Bulletin.

On December 11, 1990, the College of Humanities and Social Sciences Committee on Scholastic Standards and Petitions approved a proposal to specify which courses students in the Music Education program would take to fulfill the general education requirement in Mathematics/Analytical Reasoning.

This specification is necessary in order to meet the accreditation standards of NASDTEC (National Association of State Directors of Teacher Education and Certification). A program must be NASDTEC approved in order for its graduates to receive teacher certification in this state.
