

FACULTY ADVISORY COMMITTEE  
ANNUAL REPORT 1984-1985

The Faculty Advisory Committee met regularly after each meeting of the Faculty Senate and on other occasions by special call for a total of nine meetings.

Major items of business for the year included:

1. Interpretation of the revised Code of Student Responsibility so as not to preclude appeal from the University Academic Responsibility Committee to the President and to the Board of Trustees.
2. Consideration of the proposal (before the South Carolina Legislature) of the Model Administrative Procedure Act and its potential impact on University tenure procedures. The Model Act was not adopted by the Legislature.
3. Consideration of the relationship of the Freedom of Information Act to University tenure procedures.
4. Concurred with a proposed change in course auditing policy subsequently adopted by the Board of Trustees.
5. Concluded that the conditional admission program, whereby university students are to be advised in colleges of their choice even if they do not meet the admissions criteria of those colleges, does not infringe upon faculty prerogatives concerning admission to degree programs within the colleges.
6. Recommended, in conjunction with the Committee on Curricula and Courses, Faculty Senate adoption of a resolution clarifying the jurisdiction of the Committee on Curricula and Courses. The proposal was subsequently adopted by the Faculty Senate.
7. Considered, pursuant to paragraph 3, page 40 of the Faculty Manual, a case involving termination of a tenured member of the faculty.
8. The chairman participated, ex officio, on the Senate Steering Committee and on the Academic Affairs and Faculty Liaison Committee of the Board of Trustees.
