Proposed Wording

- 2. MAJOR REQUIREMENTS
 - a. General Major
 All history majors must complete at least thirty semester hours of history courses, which may include the six hours of freshman history applied to the General Education Requirements. Twenty-four hours must come from courses at the 300 level or above.
 - I. Six hours U.S. history, at least one course at the 300 level or above.
 - II. Six hours modern European history, at least one course at the 300 level or above.
 - III. Six hours, three from A and three from B. At least three of the six hours must be at the 300 level or above.

IV. Junior-Senior seminar or Senior thesis. (HIST 499)

V. Nine additional hours at the 300 level or above from any of the above fields.

The department will determine into which of the ^{four} groups specific history courses fall. Exceptions to distribution requirements must be approved by the Undergraduate Committee of the Department of History.

b. Intensive Major

Courses in History numbered 300 level and above, to include a minimum of 6 hours at any level of each of the following areas: United States history, European history, and non-Western History (which includes Latin America) . . . 36

(Note: an intensive major must maintain a B average in all History courses, an overall grade point of 2.50, and a foreign language requirement which may be satisfied either by passing 12 to 14 hours of one foreign language or by satisfactory performance on the second-year proficiency examination.)

b. Intensive Major

Courses in history numbered 300 level and above, to include a minimum of ^{six} 6 hours at any level of each of the following areas: United States history, European history, and non-Western history (which includes Latin America). Junior-Senior seminar or Senior thesis is required 36

(Note: an intensive major must maintain ^{at least} a B average in all History courses, an overall grade point of 2.50, and a foreign language requirement which may be satisfied either by passing ^{twelve} 12 to 14 ^{fourteen} hours of one foreign language or by satisfactory performance on the second-year proficiency examination.)
