Of the total of 587, 584 changes were recommended and 3 were not. 25 of the recommended changes were posted early. The overwhelming majority of requests for grade changes were submitted on the basis of a computational or a recording error on the part of the professor. The requests for grade changes in 1982-83 represent around a 35% increase over the number of changes requested in the preceding year.
