REPORT OF FACULTY ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Referred to the Scholastic Standards and Petitions Committee

The Faculty Advisory Committee recommends the following changes in the functions and duties of the college Scholastic Standards and Petitions committees:

Scholastic Standards and Petitions

Each College shall elect from its faculty a Committee on Scholastic Standards and Petitions (hereafter referred to as the "College Committee") to oversee the academic progress of undergraduate majors within its degree programs. This committee is authorized to formulate regulations concerning the scholastic standards of degree programs within the college; provided, however, that these shall not be lower than the general university standards. Such regulations shall govern:

1. Criteria for entrance into degree programs;
2. Criteria for determining scholastic eligibility of majors enrolled in degree programs;
3. The number of majors that a degree program may accommodate;
4. Attendance

In order to become effective, such regulations formulated by a College Committee, approved by the college faculty, must be submitted to the University Committee on Scholastic Standing and Petitions during the semester prior to the proposed implementation date. They must then be submitted to the Faculty Senate together with the recommendation of the University Committee. The regulations take effect following publication in the official University Bulletin unless rescinded by the Faculty Senate.

Standards

- 1. Criteria for entrance into degree programs;
- 2. Criteria for determining scholastic eligibility of majors enrolled in degree programs;
- 3. The number of majors that a degree program may accommodate;
- 4. Attendance

The College Committee is also authorized to act on petitions concerning both University and College academic regulations. The College Committee will be the final authority on petitions involving College academic regulations.

A student who is not in good academic standing may appeal to the Faculty Advisory Committee for a review of his or her academic standing. The Faculty Advisory Committee shall have the final authority on such appeals.

The decisions of the College Committee concerning University regulations may be appealed to the University Committee of Scholastic Standards and Petitions by either the student or the dean of the college.

In the event that a student who meets the requirements to continue enrollment in the University is not allowed to continue in a particular degree program, no record of that action will be made in the student's file.

The College Committee shall make an annual report on the number of petitions received and the disposition of each to the University Committee by September 1.

The Faculty Advisory Committee recommends the following description of the University Committee on Scholastic Standards and Petitions:

Committee on Scholastic Standards and Petitions

This Committee shall consider matters concerning University academic requirements and standards. The Committee will also review current policies and practices and proposed changes of the colleges and make recommendations to the appropriate college faculty or to the Faculty Senate.

The Committee will act as a court of original jurisdiction on all petitions by students in the undeclared major programs.

The decisions of the college committees concerning University regulations may be appealed to the University Committee by either the student or the dean of the college.

As a regular faculty committee, the membership of the committee shall include six faculty members elected in accordance with the guidelines provided above under FACULTY COMMITTEES. In addition, there shall be two student members who shall be designated by the President of the Student Government Association and confirmed by the Student Senate. The Registrar shall serve as an ex-officio member without voting privileges. The chairman of the committee shall be notified of the student appointees no later than October 1 of the year in which they will serve.

REPORT OF FACULTY ADVISORY COMMITTEE

It has come to the attention of this Committee that two new forms (AS-5, Assignment of Incomplete Grade and AS-6, Application for Independent Study or Internship Contract) have been distributed to the faculty of the University.

These forms impose restrictions and requirements on the faculty which have not heretofore been imposed. These forms pose restrictions on faculty action in respect to grading and teaching which have not previously been approved by the faculty.

Therefore, we recommend the faculty ignore these forms until such time that appropriate faculty approval has been obtained.
