Proposed Change in Regulations Concerning Dropping a Course

It is recommended by the Faculty Advisory Committee, with the concurrence of the Committee on Scholastic Standards and Petitions, that the regulations concerning "Dropping a Course" be modified as follows:

Present wording (page 15, Undergraduate Bulletin):

"Courses dropped during the first six weeks of a semester will not be recorded on a student's permanent record and will not enter into the computation of hours attempted, grade point ratio, or any other totals."

Revised wording:

"A student may drop a course by submitting a properly executed schedule change form to the Office of Student Records.

Courses dropped during the late registration period will not be recorded on a student's permanent record. Thereafter, during the first six weeks of a semester, the grade of "W" will be recorded for any course dropped.

The remainder of the paragraph remains unchanged. Editorial changes to incorporate this modification must also be made in the second paragraph of the same section, under "Withdrawal" on page 16, under "Grading System" on page 18, in the footnote on page 18, and possibly in other places.
