Request for Changes in Standards

Entrance Requirements (p 103u)

Admission to the Professional Program

As Appears in 1981-82 Catalog

Proposed

Students must apply for admission to the professional program in the semester in which 60 hours are completed.

Students must apply for admission to the professional program in the semester after 45 hours are completed.

Students must have 2.0 grade point ratio.

Students must have 2.2 grade point ratio.

Students must have "C" or better in English 101, 102.

Students must have "C" or better in English 101, 102, Biology 120, Physics 101, Physical Education 223 and 224.

no requirement

Transfer students must complete a minimum of one semester of satisfactory work on the University of South Carolina-Columbia campus before being admitted to the professional program in Physical Education.

A student must apply to the College of Education for admission to the professional program.

Students who are admitted to the teacher education track (there are 3 non-teacher certification tracks of study in the Department of Physical Education) must satisfy the professional program requirements of the College of Education. Students in the teacher education track will not be allowed to alter the degree requirements for directed teaching.

Transfer Admissions (p 103u)

Transfer students with fewer than 60 hours may enter the pre-professional program in the Department of Physical Education if they meet all University requirements.

1. Students transferring from accredited 4-year institutions must be in good standing (2.0) and have an overall grade point ratio of 2.0 to enter pre-professional or professional programs in physical education.
2. Students from 2-year or junior colleges must have an overall grade point ratio of 2.5 or better.
3. A grade of "C" or better must be earned on all courses listed for admission to the professional program in physical education.

4. ~~Students may not transfer credit for any course which carries a grade less than "C".~~

Progression Requirements

Student must earn "C" in all course work in Education, Physical Education and Health Education.

The student must earn a "C" in all major course work including major and minor emphases and education courses.

no statement

Student may attempt to earn a satisfactory grade in a major course no more than two times.

Only if a valid case for taking the course a third time is established will such be allowed.

Validity of a case will be determined by review of a formal petition filed with the Department of Physical Education's Scholastic Standards and Petitions Committee.

Completion of remedial course work may be required.

Students enrolled in the Department of Physical Education are subject to University regulations regarding probation, suspension and readmission described in this Bulletin.

Standards for general eligibility to continue in the University are described in the Bulletin.

The Department of Physical Education has additional standards:

-if the semester, yearly or cumulative grade point ratio of a student is below 2.0, the student will be notified by the Department via written communication that he/she is in jeopardy;

-if a student has 2 consecutive semesters of grade point ratio below 2.0 and a cumulative grade point ratio below 2.0, the student will be suspended from academic programs in the Department of Physical Education;

-to be reinstated the student must achieve an overall grade point ratio of 2.0 and have the endorsement of the Scholastic Standards and Petitions Committee of the Department.
