<p><b>Progression Requirements</b></p> <p><b>Lower Division.</b> All students in the lower division in the baccalaureate program are subject to the following regulations:</p> <p><b>1.</b> Students must maintain a minimum GPA of 2.50.</p> <p><b>Upper Division.</b> Progression into upper-division nursing occurs in the spring and fall semesters. Factors considered in the progression decision include:</p> <p><b>1.</b> a minimum cumulative USC and collegiate summary grade point average of 2.50 or better (Progression is competitive and limited to a set number of qualified students, to be determined each semester, based on progression GPA.)</p>	<p><b>Progression Requirements</b></p> <p><b>Lower Division.</b> All students in the lower division in the baccalaureate program are subject to the following regulations:</p> <p><b>1.</b> Students must maintain a minimum GPA of <del>2.50</del> <u>2.75</u>.</p> <p><b>Upper Division.</b> Progression into upper-division nursing occurs in the spring and fall semesters.
