FACULTY SALARY STATISTICS

All Faculty --- % Increase F77 to F78
Salaries - National + 6.0%
Clemson + 11.9% (N = 592)
USC + 12.7% (N = 891)

Incumbent Faculty -- % Increase F77 to F78
Salaries - National + 7.2%
Clemson + 11.2% (weighted est. avg.)
USC + 13.8% (weighted est. avg.)

USC's % increase for incumbent faculty is almost double the national average, and better than 2½% more than Clemson's. Ranking by salary for USC is higher than Clemson's for the three upper faculty ranks.

% increase for total faculty salaries from 1977-78 to 1978-79 at USC was 13%, compared to Clemson's 12% and the national average of 6%.

For all ranks but instructor, USC's avg. salary exceeds the national average for Public Universities.
