- I) The Committee brings to the Senate's attention a change in the progression requirement for undergraduate students in the College of Business Administration. The change was passed by the faculty of the College. It will go into the new catalog, replacing the material on page 57 of the current catalog, and will take effect beginning with the first summer session of 1981.

Progression Requirements

At the end of the Spring semester each year, all students' academic records for the previous twelve months (summer, fall and spring semesters) will be reviewed. A student majoring in Business Administration whose semester, yearly, or cumulative Grade Point Ratio is below 2.0 is considered to be scholastically deficient. A statement of the deficiency will appear on the student's grade report at the end of each term.

Any BA student who has a grade point deficit of 21 will be ineligible to continue in the College of Business Administration. A student will remain ineligible for a period of two full semesters beginning with the fall semester and not including the summer sessions. A student declared ineligible for the fall semester may attend the preceding summer sessions at the University. If the grade point deficit is less than 21 at the end of the summer sessions, the ineligibility will be cancelled.

A student on ineligibility from the College of Business Administration may not be admitted to, or continue in, any program or course of the College of Business Administration for credit or for grade point ratio purposes. Business Administration and economics credits earned at other institutions while a student is on ineligibility from the College may not be applied toward a degree in Business Administration.
